Dear Parent/ Carer,

Students in Years 7-10 will soon be sitting assessments in our second Assessment Week of 2023-24. There are three formal Assessment Weeks each academic year which help us to monitor progress towards Summit Steps and ensure all students are securing the knowledge they need to be successful.

Year 7 and 9 have their Assessment Week 11th - 15th March

Year 8 and 10 have their Assessment Week 18th - 22nd March.

The Year 10 students will sit their English Language paper 1 on Wednesday 6th March before their Assessment Week. The exam halls will be set up for the Year 11 mock exams, and this will give the Year 10 students a chance to experience real exam conditions. Students will learn details in their English lessons and through assembly. Students have access to the Google Classroom which has all of the resources and materials they need to prepare for the exam.

You will find below, the list of topics which will be assessed in the week, which will help students prepare themselves over the half-term break and during the week.

These assessments will be completed in class during normal lesson time, and teachers will further prepare students in the minutes before the assessments so that they have the best possible chance of succeeding. The information from these assessments will be used in conjunction with the teachers' understanding of the students' classwork and Extended Learning to inform the report which you will receive in April.

Assessment Weeks provide a regular opportunity for students in Years 7-10, whereby each cycle of assessments feels more familiar which can help to reduce anxiety for formal examinations. Our ambition is that the exam season at the end of Year 11 will feel familiar and that all of our students can perform to the very best of their ability.

If students have any questions about the assessments in a particular subject, they should consult that subjects' Google Classroom or their teacher for that subject.
