The Blue Pathway

The blue pathway focuses on academic rigor of achieving the English Baccalaureate whilst giving students the opportunity to choose another subject they may enjoy. The English Baccalaureate or Ebacc is made up of English, maths, science, history or geography, and a language. These are curriculum subjects which are widely recognised as relevant preparation for A Level study.

The Orange Pathway

The orange pathway involves studying either geography, history or a language together with two other options from the range of courses that we offer. This is not an Ebacc pathway. Students will study the core curriculum and have free choice to study a language, humanities and any other two courses relevant to their career aspirations.

The Yellow Pathway

The yellow pathway is a guided pathway for specific students who will liaise with Mr Hall, Ms Watson and Mr Taplin to select appropriate courses for them in consultation with parents.

We will analyse your child's results from their second assessment week together with their prior attainment and recommend a suitable pathway for them. This will be communicated with students and parents to inform your decision.

We have developed a Year 9 options page on our school website which we urge you to visit. This will give you:-

- More information about each of the option subjects.
- Videos from lead teachers in each area that will give you a clear understanding of courses.
- General information about the Year 9 options process.

Actions for you and your child:-

- 1. Visit the Year 9 options website.
- 2. Watch videos from Mr Edwards, Mr Taplin and directors of subject.
- 3. Consider the different pathways and subjects and ensure you are selecting the best one for future success.
- 4. The student will receive a google form which must be completed by Monday 18th March.
