Dear Parent/Carer,

In order to further support student's progress in Art and Design during this current Covid lockdown, we would like to offer students an art materials pack to use at home.

At Lealands we recognise the importance of a broad and balanced creative curriculum. We would like all Key Stage 3 and GCSE Art students to receive an art pack to ensure they can continue to engage in creative lessons during this time of online learning. This would also support students completing extended learning and our GCSE students with their Unit 1: Portfolio submission worth 60% of their final grade.

The Key Stage 3 pack will include: HB/2B pencils, eraser, sharpener, watercolour paint set, thick & thin paint brushes, A5/A4 cartridge paper, all contained in a zip wallet.

The GCSE pack will include all the above and a set of oil pastels, fineliner pen, and glue stick.

We would like to ensure that all students are able to have an art pack and we realise that 2020 has been difficult for many of our families, and some may be struggling financially. Therefore, if your child is currently in receipt of Free School Meals, we will donate the pack to your child. If you are in a fortunate position, and are able to offer more, to support another child, we and they would be very grateful.

If you are able to support this initiative by donating the cost of a pack: £4 for KS3 or £6 for GCSE, this would be greatly appreciated. Payment can be made online via the link from our school website. Please do not send in any money to the school as we are now cashless.

Key worker children or vulnerable students who are accessing our in school provision will receive their art pack during the next few days. Students working from home will have their pack delivered over the next few weeks.
