Dear Parent/Carer,

As you know, we are currently experiencing some very pleasant weather, although in some of our school classrooms, temperatures can become uncomfortably high.

The forecast is anticipating a further rise in temperature over the weekend and continued warm weather beyond this.

As a result and in order that students can maintain focus and work to the best of their ability throughout the school day, being as comfortable as possible, we will **permit the wearing of Lealands PE kit (branded t-shirt and branded shorts/skort/tracksuit trousers) throughout the day from Monday 22nd June until further notice.**

This decision will be reviewed on a weekly basis and we reserve the right to revert back to full school uniform before the end of term if the weather changes.

Students must attend in either their normal uniform (blazers are not required in lessons and will not be required around the school until further notice) or Lealands School PE kit as detailed in the [uniform policy](#).

Students may also wear school trousers/skirt (of the appropriate length) with their Lealands PE kit top.

Please ensure that all other aspects of the uniform are maintained. If wearing a shirt, the appropriate school tie must be worn. Shoes must either be plain black leather-type school shoes or PE trainers if wearing PE shorts.


Our uniform standards are high and consistent and we very much appreciate your support with this; we have worked hard to maintain this throughout the academic year and continue to do so.
