New School Communication System

School Gateway



From January 2026, we will be moving to a new communication system called School Gateway. This easy-to-use app will help streamline how we share important updates, letters, messages, and attendance information with you.

School Gateway will allow parents and carers to receive school communications instantly on their phones or devices—making it quicker and more convenient to stay up to date with everything happening in school.

In the coming weeks, we will share simple instructions on how to download the app and get set up. We encourage all families to join us on School Gateway so we can continue to improve how we connect with our school community. This new app will replace the current MyED app and will cease to be used from 31st December 2025. You can down load the app now and set up your logins via the Google Play/Apple App store now in preparation for it to go live in January 2026.

Our Year 7 girls basketball team have had a great first season and made it to the finals against Cardinal Newman.


In a well fought game, they lost out in the end 28-18. Well done girls for coming in 2nd place in Luton.

Sports Hall Athletics



Attendance Update

Winter often brings a peak in illnesses like the flu, common cold, and norovirus. This surge can frequently result in higher rates of student sickness, consequently leading to increased school absences during the colder months.

Did you know however that Pharmacists can offer advice on a range of illnesses, such as coughs, colds, sore throats, ear infections and aches and pains. They can also give advice about medicines. This includes how to use your medicine, worries about side effects or any other questions you have. If they cannot help you themselves, they can refer you to a GP or other health professional.

Most pharmacies can also offer prescription medicine for some conditions, without you needing to see a GP or make an appointment. This is called Pharmacy First.

Conditions they can offer prescription medicine for are:

- impetigo (aged 1 year and over)
- infected insect bites (aged 1 year and over)
- earache (aged 1 to 17 years)
- sore throat (aged 5 years and over)
- sinusitis (aged 12 years and over)

If you go to a pharmacy with one of these conditions, the pharmacist will offer you advice, treatment or refer you to a GP or other health professional if needed. They will also update your GP health record, but your information will not be shared with anyone else.

The closest pharmacies to offer this near Lelalands include:

- Rowlands Pharmacy (Sundon Park Road)
- Moakes Pharmacy (Marsh Farm Shopping centre)
- Hockwell Ring Pharmacy (The Green, Hockwell Ring)



Reader Leader Training

This exciting initiative gives our Year 10 students the opportunity to build on their leadership skills and become trained reading mentors for selected Year 7 students.

Interest in the programme was incredibly high. Our Year 10s submitted thoughtful applications; explaining why they felt they would make strong Reader Leaders. The standard was so impressive that selecting the final group proved extremely difficult. Their enthusiasm, maturity and genuine passion for supporting younger students shone through.



As part of their training, delivered by staff from the University of Bedfordshire, the Reader Leaders explored:

- What makes an effective Reader Leader
- Why reading is so important, both academically and personally
- How to model good reading habits and guide younger readers
- Strategies for discussing texts, including choosing key topics and themes
- The importance of "Book Talk"—engaging readers through questions, predictions, conversation, and interactive discussion

The programme goes beyond simply listening to someone read. Reader Leaders act as positive role models, helping to build confidence, nurture a love of reading and encourage meaningful conversations around books and learning.

We are incredibly proud of our Year 10 students for taking on this responsibility and we look forward to seeing the positive impact they will have on our Year 7 readers throughout the year.




Grant Approved....

Severe Weather Procedure

Occasionally during the year, particularly in Winter, we experience spells of very bad weather (e.g. snow). During these times we will always do our very best to keep the school open. However, there may be occasions that we have to make the decision to close based on:

- the safety and wellbeing of students and staff
- the number of teachers who are able to safely travel to school to determine if we have adequate numbers of teachers to take classes
- the severity of the weather, which impacts on whether the school grounds are safe for students, teachers and visitors

In the event that the school has to close, we will always endeavour to give as much notice as possible. The school will follow these procedures to notify parents/carers:

- **Update the school website** a message will appear in red running across the top of the home screen, this should be your first point of reference.
- **App Message** parents/carers who have downloaded our new School Gateway Parent App will receive a message directly to the app.
- **Text Message*** parents/carers who have not downloaded our Parent App, will receive a text message. *Please ensure you inform us if any of your contact details change so we always have the most up to date information for you. Failure to do so may result in messages not being received.
- Social Media Updates keep an eye on our Facebook and Instagram pages for updates.
- Inform Local Authority The school will inform Luton Borough Council, who have a page dedicated to school closures. This can be found on their website at http://www.luton.gov.uk/schoolclosures
- Local radio stations no longer update live lists on their websites (although they will read out lists on air).

Children/Young People's safety around lakes, rivers and bodies of open water

Dear Parents,

We want to alert parents and young people of the potential dangers and risk to life of playing near and on frozen bodies of water in Bedfordshire.

We would ask all parents and carers to talk to their children and remind them of the dangers of ice and water and why they must keep away from it.

Frozen lakes, ponds, canals and reservoirs can look picturesque, but they can be lethal. There can be no greater warning of this than last year's awful event.

The cold weather can lead to bodies of water freezing over and creating hazardous conditions. We understand the temptation to walk across or play on the frozen water, but we would like to urge everyone to see the dangers are associated with frozen water.

Our advice is to never go on to the ice under any circumstances. The ice may appear thicker than it is but please be aware that ice can be weak, especially as you move further from the edge. If you were to fall in it can be extremely dangerous due to the cold temperatures of the water and the possibility of currents pushing you under unbroken ice.

RLSS UK offer safety advice for winter water safety, with simple steps to keep safe during the winter:

- 1. Never go onto the ice to play, to retrieve an object, or a pet.
- 2. Never enter the ice to rescue somebody, call 999 and ask for the Fire and Rescue Service

What to do if YOU accidentally fall through ice:

- Stay calm and shout for help Spread your arms out across the surface of the ice in front of you Lie
 flat and use your arms to pull yourself over the ice towards the shore If the ice on the water breaks,
 try to make your way to the bank or shore, breaking ice in front of you as you go
- If you find yourself stuck and unable to escape, wait for help. Stay as still as possible to conserve
- your energy. Bring your arms close to your sides and keep your legs together, while keeping your
- head out of the water
- When you're safely out of the water it's important to go to hospital for a check-up


