I continue to be overwhelmed with pride when I think of all the things our students and staff have coped with so well over the past year. Our Year 11 students, in particular, have had the most uncertain of times followed by immense pressure to perform in numerous assessments, and yet, they have risen to every challenge with resilience and positivity. They will soon be leaving us with a few having some final chances to complete more assessments so that the evidence we have of their attainment is the strongest possible. I was pleased that we were able to offer an Easter School which included some fun and enjoyment in the pool and on the field. centre and planning for various other exciting events, trips and activities is already underway.

We are also starting to plan for September, with some uncertainty, but hoping that we can have greater flexibility and fewer restrictions. Thanks to feedback from parents, staff and students we are looking at what has worked really well this year for us to continue and what we want to change back to how it was or adapt to something new. We are planning to keep the different coloured ties for each year group as this has been really helpful in identifying which year students belong to very easily. We are also now looking at whether to continue staggered starts and ends to the school day and year specific entrances which have helped with congestion previously experienced at the beginning and end of the day. Further details will be communicated as decisions are made over the course of the rest of the term.

Through the many schemes over the past year, we have acquired around 360 Chromebooks for student use, most of which were lent to students for home learning. As these are returned, we are excited to be able to enhance the use of technology in the classroom. Building further on this, our new Year 7 students will all be invited into a scheme to have their own Chromebook with them in school for every lesson. This will be a pilot year and allow us to work on seamlessly integrating online and computer based work with in-class education. We are very excited by this excellent development.

As we move towards the end of this term and into next, we do hope to be able to see more of you all in person at the many events that we have missed so much in recent times.








EPRAISE

KEEP UP TO DATE WITH YOUR CHILD'S LEARNING

Epraise is an online platform for schools that enables parents to engage with their children's education. There are specific versions for both parents and students to access. You can access your child's attendance, timetable, STEP points, demerits, extended learning, milestones and achievements. Epraise can be accessed online through your internet browser at <u>www.epraise.co.uk</u>, or through an app on your mobile device. Visit your device's app store and search for Epraise.



Students earn 'Striving Towards Excellence Points' (STEPs) for showing an outstanding attitude to their learning. STEPs can be

awarded during lessons to students who fully engage with the lesson and for completing work and extended learning to a good standard. If students are not engaging in their lessons or do not conduct themselves in the correct way, teachers will issue them with a demerit. The number of STEPs and demerits accrued by each student, with the reason for them, can be viewed by both parents and students on Epraise.

To reward students and motivate them towards excellence, students can 'cash in' their STEP points on various purchases from our Epraise shop. Purchases range in values; the more STEP points your child earns, the higher the value of item they can purchase.

Our Epraise shop is open, so take a look at what they could buy. We currently have Sony headphones, HP keyboards, calculators, wireless mouse devices, school ties, stationary items, plus much more...items sell out quickly so don't miss out!

EASTER PROGRAMME REVIEW

29TH MARCH - 9TH APRIL 2021

During the Easter holidays, Lealands welcomed a combination of Year 7-9 students for a special Easter programme. Some had seized the opportunity to come into school to take advantage of additional study time in English, maths and science, whilst others were keen to have the chance to have fun with friends and spend time doing some physical activities. With Covid restrictions still in place, it was an ideal opportunity for students to get out of the house and spend time with their friends within the safe environment of their 'bubbles'.

The programme was a great success. Students really enjoyed spending more one on one time with dedicated staff and getting extra support in their core subjects in the morning, followed by a range of fun activities in the afternoon. It was great to see the large number of students arriving in the afternoon to join the sessions. These included Summer sports out on the field and astro like; rounders, softball and football, plus STEM experiments in the Science Department and even some mindfulness activities.



The Year 7 students loved the 45 minute swimming lessons in our pool. Lessons focused on the core aquatic skills; learning to be safe in the water, as well as improving their strokes and having a lot of fun while doing it.

At the time of writing this, here are the students who are the top ten readers from Year 7 and 8! This is based on how many times they have surpassed their target. Congratulations to them!



The Health HUB will be the first point of contact for each of the services it covers. Calls will include:



- Help with accessing clinics


