


#### **EPRAISE**

#### KEEP UP TO DATE WITH YOUR CHILD'S LEARNING

Epraise is an online platform for schools that enables parents to engage with their children's education. There are specific versions for both parents and students to access. You can access your child's attendance, timetable, STEP points, demerits, extended learning, milestones and achievements. Epraise can be accessed online through your internet browser at <a href="https://www.epraise.co.uk">www.epraise.co.uk</a>, or through an app on your mobile device. Visit your device's app store and search for Epraise.

Students earn 'Striving Towards Excellence Points' (STEPs) for showing an outstanding attitude to their learning. STEPs can be awarded during lessons to students who fully engage with the



lesson and for completing work and extended learning to a good standard. If students are not engaging in their lessons or do not conduct themselves in the correct way, teachers will issue them with a demerit. The number of STEPs and demerits accrued by each student, with the reason for them, can be viewed by both parents and students on Epraise.

To reward students and motivate them towards excellence, students can 'cash in' their STEP points on various purchases from our Epraise shop. Purchases range in values; the more STEP points your child earns, the higher the value of item they can purchase.

Our Epraise shop is open, so take a look at what they could buy. We currently have Sony headphones, HP keyboards, calculators, wireless mouse devices, school ties, stationary items, plus much more...items sell out quickly so don't miss out!

#### Transition from Year 6 to Year 7

The Transition journey started in June for most of our students. Myself (Miss Cussen, Head of Year) and Mrs Ojulah (Pastoral Support Manager), visited many primary schools and delivered assemblies; introducing ourselves to our new Year 7s for September 2021 and explaining everything that Lealands has to offer. Other students experienced the assembly online through Google Meets or Zoom. Later in the month students and parents were invited to a virtual Transition Evening. This was held in a Google Classroom. It was a brilliant opportunity for some of the students and parents to meet some members of staff and learn more about Lealands and answer any questions they had. Furthermore, the students then had a Transition Day. This involved Mrs Ojulah and myself visiting our main 6 feeder schools. During these sessions we delivered a workshop on completing the students' Transition Passports; setting them up for life at Lealands High School. Other students had their Transition Passports posted to them; ready to complete for September.

#### First Induction Day

On Friday 3rd September, the journey began for our new orange tie students at Lealands. These students are the newest group of students; a group of students that the school had been looking forward to welcoming for a very long time. After much planning and preparation, the school was ready to welcome our new Year 7s. They were very lucky to



have the whole of the school to themselves for the first day. When they walked through the school gates for the first time at 8:30am as Lealands students, a wide range of emotions could be seen across their faces. Many of these students were beaming with excitement, a few had a lot of worries when they turned up.

The students lined up straight away in their new tutor groups ready to

start their journey at Lealands High School. During the morning of Friday 3rd September,

#### **GCSE RESULTS**

**CLASS OF 2021** 

The cohort of 2021 did not have the opportunity to sit their exams due to the Coronavirus pandemic. Instead, students' teachers submitted TAGs (Teacher Assessed Grades) based on students' work, including their mock exams and assessments in May and June. Our students were incredibly positive, rising to the challenge of the additional assessments.

We knew that the 2021 cohort would be strong, and we are pleased that the final GCSE grades reflect their ability and work ethic.

- 75% of students achieved grades 9-4 in one of their GCSE English qualifications.
- 55% of students achieved grades 9-5 in one of their GCSE English qualifications.
- 71% of students achieved grades 9-4 in GCSE mathematics.
- 47% of students achieved grades 9-5 in GCSE mathematics.
- 63% of students achieved grades 9-4 in both GCSE English and mathematics.
- 39% of students achieved grades 9-5 in both GCSE English and mathematics.
- 74% of students achieved grades 9-5 in GCSE Spanish.
- 96% of students achieved grades at or above Level 2 Pass (equivalent to GCSE grade 4) in Health and Social Care.
- Overall, 243 grade 9-7s were achieved by this year's students.

#### Special congratulations go to:

- Pranay who achieved 8 grades 9s, including English, mathematics, biology, chemistry and physics and a Level 2 Distinction\* (the top possible grade in the course)
- Tennyson who achieved 7 grades 9s, a grade 8 and a Level 2 Distinction.
- Nana who achieved five grade 9s and two grade 8s and two Level 2 Distinctions\*
- Hannah who achieved 5 grade 9s, 3 grade 8s and a Level 2 Distinction\*
- Ismat, Denisa, Israa and Hakim who all made exceptional progress.

Mr Burridge, Headteacher, said, "I have been thoroughly impressed by our students, their amazing positive attitudes and sheer hard work during the past two difficult academic years. We are pleased that this has paid off with excellent results and many outstanding outcomes. Our students should be very proud of their achievements which are as a result of rigorous and thorough assessment. I am extremely grateful to our staff who worked tirelessly to give students every opportunity to succeed and adjusted to the many demands placed on them. We are exceptionally proud of the class of 2021 and wish them every success in the future."

A reminder that all year groups should have logged into Seneca and joined their new science classes in order to access their assignments.


Year 9, 10 and 11 students should also have logged into GCSEpod ready to access their upcoming assignments.

#### **NUMERACY NEWS**





Welcome to the new academic year here at Lealands High School. To those of you who don't know me, my name is Mrs Leigh and I am the Numeracy Coordinator here at Lealands.

We all know the importance of numeracy and it is our aim to make sure all our children leave school numerate. Due to this goal, we started a big drive last year on improving the standards of numeracy at all levels of the school and this year with all the Covid restrictions being lifted, we are planning to make it bigger and better.

With the aim to improve numeracy standards this term, we have already introduced Numeracy Ninja in maths lessons for Key Stage 3; started weekly numeracy challenges during Tutor Time and also started a weekly games club for Key Stage 3. On top of this, we will also be introducing Times Table Rockstars during Year 7 Tutor Time and from October, we will be starting our numeracy monthly competitions, where students can win prizes for their efforts in numeracy. As you can see, there are lots of opportunities available here for your children to take part in and improve their numeracy, so, please encourage them to take part in as many things as possible.

As parents, you can also encourage your children to improve numeracy at home. All you have to do is show them, or let them help with everyday situations which involve maths, for example; cooking, shopping, or even planning a trip. All these everyday actions have basic numeracy in them and can assist them to improve their basic number skills. Throughout this academic year, I will be working on making numeracy accessible to parents so that you can help at home while we are helping them at school.

#### LEARNING RESOURCE CENTRE



With restrictions easing, I'm happy to see students being able to browse for books in the LRC the old fashioned way!

In their Accelerated Reader lessons, the Year 7s and 8s have all completed a STAR test now, which means they are able to choose a suitable book for their reading lesson. Students were also given a reading log which they must bring in every week for their

Accelerated Reader lessons. It is their extended learning task to read one hour a week (we recommend breaking this up so they read daily), in order for their reading age to improve. Please motivate your child to read every day and also take an interest in the book they have chosen, listen to them read and sign their reading log weekly as evidence they have read at home for one hour. Doing this will help create a reading atmosphere at home, and encourage reading to become a habit.

In addition, the STAR test also tells us their reading age which will be written in their reading logs; please make a note of this so you are aware. Students will be STAR tested every term so we hope to see an increase in their reading age.

Thank you for your support with this programme. The success of Accelerated Reader is largely contributed to by the support and encouragement from our student's parents/guardians, so thank you in advance. Now that we are starting a new term of Accelerated Reader, the next update will be congratulating students who have reached their target!

- Enter the username and password from the letter you have received or from the logins document attached.
- After logging in for the first time, you will be asked to accept the terms and conditions.
- You will then need to set some memorable questions, in case you forget your password.
- Click on 'Tasks' at the top to see the work your teacher has set up for you.
- To complete the activities, click on 'Start' at the side to begin.

Feel free to ask your language teacher if you have any questions or doubts about how to use ActiveLearn.

Remember, the more you put into this, the more you will get out of it – many students have used it to gain excellent progress in the past. Have fun!



#### **ART & ARTSMARK**





## WHAT IS AN APPRENTICESHIP? 8 key facts you need to know





#### An apprenticeship is a real job

Available to individuals aged 16+ (with no upper age limit), apprentices are typically employed for at least 30 hours per week.



#### Apprentices are paid a salary

All apprentices will earn a salary of at least the National Minimum Wage for apprentices which is currently £4.30\* per hour. Many employers pay more!



#### Apprenticeships last a minimum of 12 months

Most apprenticeships take between 1 - 4 years to complete. It will depend on the level and delivery model of the apprenticeship.



#### Apprenticeships range from level 2 to level 7

There are apprenticeships at levels equivalent to GCSEs right up to Master's level and you can now achieve a degree through an apprenticeship.



#### Apprentices do not pay for their training

All apprenticeship costs are paid for by the employer and/or the government meaning that an apprentice will never have to pay for their training.



#### Apprentices will receive 20% off-the-job learning

20% of an apprentice's paid time will be spent undertaking off-the-job learning, gaining valuable skills and qualifications.



#### Apprentices will spend 80% of their time on-the-job

80% of an apprentice's paid time will be spent on-the-job, working with colleagues to learn new skills and gain experience of the workplace.



#### There are thousands of apprenticeships in more than 170 industries

New apprenticeships are advertised each week covering a wide range of job roles. You will be amazed at the variety and breadth available!
