
Headteacher's Introduction

The staff at Lealands are ecstatic with our GCSE results and students deserve to be too!

This record breaking year group have built on success from our very successful recent years and we are delighted with their attainment and progress.

This year group had a very challenging start to their time at Lealands as their first 2 years of High School were impacted by the pandemic.

When they returned to school they were a brilliant group who we knew would do well.

Our students worked tirelessly and achieved some fantastic results which will support them in their next steps in Year 12 and beyond.


- 58% of students achieved at least 5 grades 9-4 including English and mathematics.
- 36% of students achieved at least 5 grades 9-5 including English and mathematics.
- 66% of students achieved grades 9-4 in both GCSE English and mathematics.
- 39% of students achieved grades 9-5 in both GCSE English and mathematics.
- 79% of students achieved grades 9-4 in GCSE English.
- 67% of students achieved grades 9-4 in GCSE Maths.
- 69% of students achieved grades 9-5 in GCSE English.
- Fine Art was amongst our strongest subjects with excellent outcomes with 97% of students achieving 9-4

Special congratulations go to:

- Liam who achieved 3 grade 9s in English, Maths and Science as well as 2 grade 8s and 3 grade 7s
- Amina who achieved a grade 9, 5 grade 8s and 2 grade 7s including English, mathematics, science, geography, sociology and design technology.
- Roshni who achieved 6 grade 8s and 2 grade 7s
- Kelise, our Deputy Head Girl, who achieved an average grade of 7.63
- Demir, our Head Boy, who achieved an average grade of 7.50

We are delighted that 6 of our students achieved Progress 8 scores greater than +2, an enormous well done to Nabeeha, Omer, Jahkeime, Ishrat, Shayan and Caitlin.

Mr Burridge, Headteacher, said, "It was wonderful to see the joy and happiness of our students receiving their GCSE grades after such challenging times and the anxiety of the revised grading system this year. Students and staff have worked tirelessly. We are so proud of our students and wish them every success in the future".

Attendance & Absence Reporting

CONTACT BEFORE 8.30

If your child is absent from school and we haven't heard from you, we begin to worry about your child's safety and will implement safeguarding procedures

KEEP IN TOUCH BY TEXT, PHONE OR EMAIL

CONTACT EVERY DAY

Even if you have told us you don't expect your child to attend on a future date, we need contact on each day of absence to confirm this. Without this, absences will be unauthorised.

GIVE DETAILED REASONING

Absences reported without any details will not be authorised. This includes not getting in touch and not giving a thorough reason. Please give us more detail than 'poorly' or 'unwell'. All information is handled confidentially and this allows us to keep accurate records as well as ensuring you can offer the best support for your child on their return to school. We can only approve a certain number of absences without a letter from a doctor, dentist, hospital or other professional.

MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS

Whilst we realise that some of these are unavoidable, appointments should be booked outside of school hours or during school holidays. If this is not possible, the amount of school time missed must be kept to a minimum. If the school does not receive any official confirmation of a medical appointment during school hours, their child will be given an unauthorised mark.

PUNCTUALITY

Students who arrive late to school need to report to Matron to sign in (KS3 after 8.30am and KS4 after 8.55am). This will be logged and monitored by the Pastoral Team for improvement. Students will be issued with a 15 minute detention. Students will be recorded with a U code which means Unauthorised Absence if they arrive after 9.00 am for KS3 (Y7, 8, and 9) or 9.25 am for KS4 (Y10 and Y11).

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

The law does not give any entitlement to parents/carers to take their child on holiday during term time. Headteachers may not grant any Leave of Absence during term time unless there are **EXCEPTIONAL** circumstances. Requests must be made in advance or the absence cannot legally be authorised. All requests must be made at least two weeks in advance to the Headteacher by completing the school application form. If you are travelling abroad, you will need to supply the school with booking details and confirmation of your return flight tickets.

School Parking

Dropping off / Collecting students by car

As you know, we take our responsibility for the safety of our students very seriously.

We have ongoing concerns about the way some cars are being used to drop off and collect students. Many vehicles have been parked in restricted areas, including on pavements, creating bottlenecks for students and inconveniencing pedestrians. Additionally, some drivers have not been following safe driving practices.

We kindly ask that, if you need to drop off or collect your child by car, you do so at location further away from the school gates—ideally near or beyond the shops in either direction.

Please avoid using the E-Learning Centre or staff car park for drop-offs and pick-ups to ensure the safety of everyone.

Thank you for your cooperation, and we trust those who have observed the situation will understand the need for this request.

Duke of Edinburgh Award

Almost 12 months ago, ten Year 10 students set out on a journey of discovery when they started their Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award. Over the course of the year, they have learned new skills; volunteered in their local communities and developed their personal fitness.

They were also able to experience the 'thrills' of lugging heavy rucksacks for miles across open countryside and sleeping on an inch of foam in sleeping bags during their expedition section.

We have been delivering the Award at Lealands for nearly 20 years and we have seen lots of changes in that time but it is still an extremely tough challenge and because of this, continues to be an internationally recognised award.

A record number of young people in the UK started their Duke of Edinburgh's Award in 2023/24 for the third year running.

DofE annual statistics reveal that 330,984 young people started their DofE, with participants giving a huge 4,725,825 million hours of volunteering in communities all over the UK as part of their programmes – a huge leap of 33% on 2022/23!

More than 545,000 young people are actively doing their DofE, and 30% of 14-year-olds in the UK started their Bronze last year.

On Thursday 17th October our superstar Year 10 students (plus 4 Year 11 students) received their DofE Bronze certificates and badges at Presentation Evening. This is truly a wonderful achievement and one which they should all be very proud of.

EPRAISE

Epraise is an online platform for schools that enables parents to engage with their children's education. There are specific versions for both parents and students to access. You can access your child's attendance, timetable, STEP points, demerits, extended learning, milestones and achievements. Epraise can be accessed online through your internet browser at www.epraise.co.uk, or through an app on your mobile device. Visit your device's app store and search for Epraise.

Students earn 'Striving Towards Excellence Points' (STEPs) for showing an outstanding attitude to their learning. STEPs can be awarded during lessons to students who fully engage with the lesson and for completing work and extended learning to a good standard. If students are not engaging in their lessons or do not conduct themselves in the correct way, teachers will issue them with a demerit. The number of STEPs and demerits accrued by each student, with the reason for them, can be viewed by both parents and students on Epraise.

To reward students and motivate them towards excellence, students can 'cash in' their STEP points on various purchases from our Epraise shop. Purchases range in values; the more STEP points your child earns, the higher the value of item they can purchase.


