## **Pressure statements**

Statement	Beware this type of statement because	My suggested responses to this statement	What would a person say if they were just talking/ ressuring – not trying to manipulate their partner?
"If you loved me you would"	This is a 'trap' statement, even if you love them it doesn't mean you have to have sex with them.		
"Everybody else is doing it"	'Generalisations' are intended to isolate the other person and make them feel that they must be wrong.		
"Don't you fan- cy me or some- thing?"	This is a 'trap' question — if you say 'yes' you must be happy with doing it, if you say 'no' then you are saying you don't fancy them.'		
"What are you? Frigid?"	Questioning or insulting someone's sexuality, personality etc. is a way to pressure them in to behaving how they want you to.		
"What are you so worried about? It'll be fine; I love you"	This is dismissing the other person's valid concerns/feelings and adding in the false reassurance of "I love you" to negate those feelings.		
"Go on have another drink, it will get you in the mood"	This is encouraging someone to get drunk to lower their inhibitions and be more likely to have sex.		
"If you won't, I'll find some- body who will"	This statement is black- mail. Anyone who makes statements like this does not love the person in the situation.
