School Uniform Requirements

School Blazer	Classic black blazer (with school logo)
Trousers/ Skirt	Black tailored trousers or black skirt. Trousers should be of standard school type and should not reflect fashion trends or materials. Leggings and jeans are not allowed. Skirts should be no more than 10cm/4ins above or below the knee, no slits and again should be of standard school type and material.
Shirt	Plain white tailored shirt, short or long sleeve with collar (no patterns or colours). Shirts should be worn tucked in at all times.
Tie	Clip-on school tie with school logo.
Shoes	Sensible plain black leather shoes. No coloured flashes, stripes, stitching or laces. They should not be high heeled or fashion shoes that are unsuitable for school wear. Boots, trainers, canvas shoes, plimsolls and sandals are not allowed. (Further guidance is available on the school website)
Socks	Plain black or grey socks.
School Jumper	School jumpers are optional and may only be worn under a blazer (not instead of).
Piercings & Hairstyles	Students may wear one pair of silver, gold or white studs (one of the pair in each earlobe). Nose studs or other facial piercings (i.e. tongues, eyebrows, tragus, etc.) are not allowed. No other jewellery or make up should be worn. Hairstyles should not reflect any extremes of fashion in either style or colour. Patterns in hair or eyebrow are not allowed.

If students arrive at school in non-uniform clothing, they may expect to be sent home to get changed or, if this is not possible, they will work in the appropriate Student Support area.

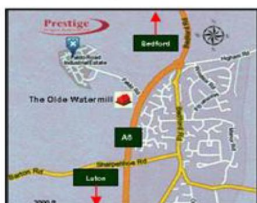

Only items displaying the Lealands Logo will be acceptable for PE lessons.

- Students will also need appropriate footwear - outdoor trainers or boots (only traditional moulded studs can be used on the astro turf – blades and screw in studs cannot be used) and indoor trainers (preferably white). All laces must be properly tied up for lessons.
- If students have long hair they must tie it back.
- For swimming lessons, students will need a towel and a **dark blue or black swimming costume/trunks**. We also advise students to bring in swimming goggles and if they have long hair they must have a swimming cap.
- We advise the wearing of mouth guards for certain activities such as football.
- No jewellery to be worn during PE lessons.

Students should have the correct PE kit for lessons, including those excused for medical reasons. These students can coach, referee or help other students analyse and evaluate their work, which is a valuable part of the National Curriculum in PE. It will also make sure students do not get their uniform wet or muddy when outside. Students who do not have correct kit must have a note from their parent or Pastoral Support Manager.

Students failing to follow the above will be given a detention or appropriate sanction.

Other Useful Information

Equipment needed for school

It is extremely important that students arrive in school ready and prepared for the school day. This means that they need to bring the appropriate equipment into school for learning.

Students will need a strong, suitable bag to carry books and equipment around the school, and to and from home. They must make sure that they have with them all their books, equipment and homework for the morning and afternoon lessons.

Students will be told what they need for each subject but they should make sure that they have the following with them every day:

- writing equipment: black pens, pencils, etc.
- ruler and a rubber
- yellow highlighter
- calculator (preferred Casio Fx-83GT PLUS)
- it is also useful for students to have some coloured pencils and a green pen.



Lost Property

We hope that students do not lose any of their possessions. It is helpful if you mark their name on all their clothing and belongings. Students should try not to leave things lying around in unsupervised rooms. If students do lose something, they should report it to the subject teacher and tutor as soon as possible.

If a student should find anyone else's property, they must hand it in to the Medical Room or a member of staff immediately.

We cannot accept liability for the loss of any property. Large sums of money and valuable items should not be brought to school. If for any reason a student has to bring something valuable to school, they must hand it to their tutor for safekeeping.

Mobile phones, headphones and items such as MP3 players, IPODs, etc., should not be used in school. If students are found using such items, or they are seen, they will be confiscated by staff. The item will be returned to the student at 3.30pm. A note will be made on the student's conduct record.

Lunchtime

During the lunch break, students may use the Dining Area, school atrium or bring a packed lunch to eat in the Main Hall. Students will not be allowed home at lunchtime.

The Dining Area offers a variety of foods at different prices at break and lunch time. Students will be told where and when to line up for their meal and will be expected to show good manners in the Dining Area and Snack Bar. Menus are published on the school web site and run on a three week cycle.

The school runs a cashless system for all students who will use a finger recognition system to pay for food and drinks. Parents add credit to the account using our online system.

If students choose to bring a packed lunch, they can eat at the outside eating areas or in the Main Hall.

Lockers

Lockers are available for students to hire for a £5.00 non-refundable charge per year. Order forms will be issued to our Year 7 students during the first week of the Autumn Term and must be returned and paid for at the School Office.

Bicycles

If students bring a bicycle to school they must follow the Lealands High School Cycling Protocols. Students should always lock their bicycle in the cycle shed provided and are responsible for its safety and security. At the end of the day, students on bicycles must leave the school site via the back gate.

A form needs to be completed and returned for any student wishing to bring a bicycle to school.

Breakfast Provision

Research tells us that breakfast is the most important meal of the day. A good breakfast provides the nutrients that people need to start their day. Studies show that children who eat a good breakfast do better in school than children who do not.

Children who eat a good breakfast have a better attendance and decreased hyperactivity. Children who don't eat breakfast tend to not perform as well, and also tend to have behaviour problems.

The Lealands' Breakfast Provision will provide a **FREE** nutritious meal for students eligible for Free School Meals who might otherwise not eat breakfast (up to the value of £1.25). A breakfast is available for all other students at a subsidised price.

The aims of Lealands' Breakfast Club are:

- to provide the energy and nutrition required by the mind and body for active learning
- to improve attendance, concentration and learning in the classroom
- to provide positive examples of healthy eating to create a foundation for lifelong healthy eating habits
- to enable children to socialise, listen and talk in a relaxed atmosphere
- encourage good social skills development with a focus on literacy

Extended Learning

Students will be set extended learning tasks by their subject teachers which they should complete in their own time. Teachers will explain the requirements and the deadlines that students need to keep. Extended learning is listed online via Epraise. Parents/ Carers with a valid email address registered with the school can register via the website.

The majority of your child's extended learning tasks will be retrieval practice or self quizzing consolidating work completed in lessons.

Students should try to find a quiet room to complete the extended learning. They will almost certainly work better away from the television and other noisy distractions.

Students should set aside a regular time to complete extended learning each evening. Many people like to tackle their extended learning as soon as they get home from school, whereas others prefer to start later when they've had a rest.

If students find that the work set is too difficult or takes an unreasonable amount of time to complete, they should discuss the problem with the relevant subject teacher and tutor. Support for extended learning is available at our extended learning club on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 3.10pm to 4.15pm in the Learning Resource Centre.

A guide to the amount of time required for each subject is provided on the school website. For further information and support, please see the section on the school website.



Learning Resource Centre (LRC) for Study Support

Extended learning clubs are run by the Learning Support Assistants on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 3.10pm to 4.15pm in the LRC.

The LRC:

- provides a quiet environment for study
- provides access to books, electronic information and the media
- helps students to develop study skills and create a basis for lifelong learning
- complements, extends and enriches classroom learning
- encourages students to achieve success and thereby raise self-esteem

Students are encouraged to attend and make use of this facility to work with others and gain extra help with extended learning and coursework.



Extra Curricular Activities

Clubs and activities take place before school, during lunchtime or after school. Students are encouraged to participate in these, as we believe they are an important part of life at Lealands. Clubs on offer vary from year to year but may include musical activities and performing arts; sporting activities of all kinds; computer club, off site trips and visits and clubs linked to various subjects such as science and languages. These are publicised termly on the school website and plasma screens in school. Students are able to register and sign up for extra curricular activities online through the EPrise App. Staff are currently finalising the extra curricular timetable for September 2020. This information will be available on the school website from the second week of the Autumn Term in September.



Student Leaders

Some students have applied, been interviewed and chosen as Student Leaders. They have responsibilities and duties around the school including being responsible for elements of Student Voice and can be identified by their purple ties. Student Leaders also help younger students during tutorial time and represent Lealands' students on formal occasions such as Presentation and Open Evenings. It is an honour and privilege to be chosen as a Student Leader.



Student Voice

Student Voice is led and organised by the Senior Student Leadership Team (SSLT), alongside Mrs Rust, Assistant Headteacher. Each tutor group has a representative and they meet with members of the SLT at least monthly. Agenda



items are shared with the Student Voice representative and they are asked to discuss this during their tutor time and bring back ideas, opinions and suggestions to the SSLT.

In addition to Student Voice, there are several opportunities for students to be further involved in activities to shape the school community. Each tutor group have the opportunity to put forward a representative to share ideas to the SLT who take responsibility for anti-bullying, equality and diversity, charities, recycling and environment and well-being throughout the school. We have Year 8 and Year 9 students who support Year 6 transition by being attached to tutor groups as well as supporting initiatives such as paired reading. Subject departments have their own leaders, who support with extra-curricular initiatives for example: sports leaders and language leaders.

We are always looking for ways to improve our Student Voice and leadership opportunities in the school. Ideas and suggestions can be fed back to the SLT who work alongside the wider student body, to implement change and improvement. All such opportunities are advertised through tutor time, assemblies, lesson time and via notice boards.

All Year 7 tutor groups will have a member of the Student Leadership Team assigned to them, and they will visit them regularly in the first term of school to support and answer questions. They may also encourage you to get involved in some tutor time competitions and events. You can recognise our Student Leaders in Year 10 and Year 11 as they will be wearing the prestigious 'purple tie'. Their pictures, alongside the Senior Student Leadership team are on a prominent notice board by the doors to the Central Courtyard, so you can always check who they are. We encourage all of our students to get fully involved in improving our school community and we hope to see as many Year 7 students signed up and shaping the future of our school.

Rewards and Achievement

At Lealands High School we are proud of the successes of our school and the individuals within the school and believe in celebrating and rewarding achievement and success.

Students can gain reward points in every lesson which can be spent on a choice of rewards through Epraise (our online platform - see below). They also receive badges and awards at certain thresholds.

Rewards assemblies take place each term where students may receive subject commendations and other rewards for excellent effort, attainment, attitudes and contributions.

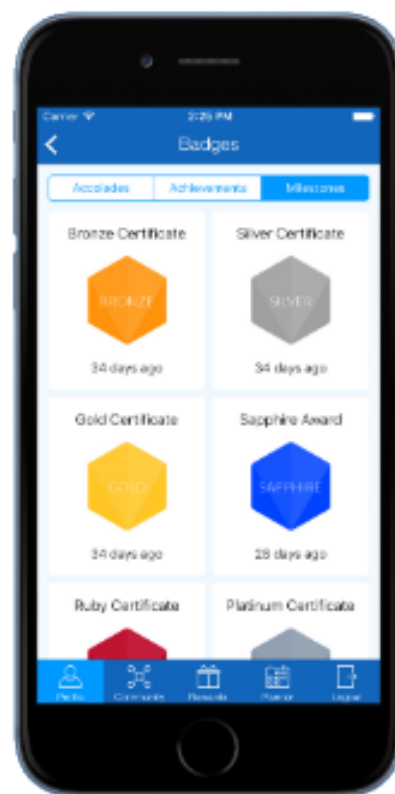
There is a formal annual Presentation Evening for students demonstrating consistent excellence to which parents are invited. Rewards and celebrations are key for us in emphasising the positive and ensuring excellent behaviour and effort.

Epraise

Epraise gives you the opportunity for live updates on how your child/children are getting on. Students are issued STEP points to celebrate their achievements and contributions. Demerits are issued when students fail to meet appropriate expectations. Epraise also gives details of home learning and your child's timetable. This is a free app which you can download or register online once your child/children join Lealands High School. As soon as you have an account set up, you can view how many STEP points your child/children have been awarded, register them for clubs and activities and see what intervention sessions may be available to them.

Rewards can be converted into prizes and your child can choose a reward from those available in the online Reward Shop.

The Epraise app can be downloaded for free and is available for IOS and Android smartphones.

Sanctions

Insistence on a good attitude to learning is extremely important in the school in order to ensure that all students make the most of their opportunities and succeed in their learning. If students follow the Student Classroom Code of Conduct and all the advice in this booklet, they should not get into trouble. If behaviour or effort are inappropriate then students should expect to receive an appropriate sanction. The school has a clear Classroom Code of Conduct which explains our expectations.



Student Classroom Code of Conduct

1. Arrive on time for the lesson.
2. Ensure that you are fully equipped for every lesson.
3. Follow the instructions given by the teacher first time of asking.
4. Treat others in the classroom with respect, giving them the courtesy and consideration that you would want to receive from others.
5. Respect the rights of other students to learn and achieve their best.
6. Try your best to achieve during the lesson, completing work to the best of your ability.
7. Be proud of your successes in class and supportive of the successes of others.

Detentions

Detentions can be given by individual teachers and may be up to 45 minutes in duration. Students may be kept for 20 minutes after school without prior notification to parents. If the detention is longer after school, parents will be informed in advance. In all detentions a learning conversation will take place in order for the student to learn from their mistakes.

As outlined in the behaviour ladder, persistent or particularly serious offences may result in:

- isolation from a particular subject for a period of time. (The student works alone away from the rest of the group.)
- being excluded from school for a fixed period of time

If parents have any problems concerning sanctions, they should talk to the appropriate Tutor or Pastoral Support Manager.



Parental Communication & Engagement

At Lealands High School communication with parents and carers is a key priority. Effective and live communication ensures you are continually aware about activities, events and updates about your child.

Communication

To communicate with you we use My Ed, which is a free to download app to send you:

- important messages and updates
- send your child's/children's reports – keeping you updated on their progress

In addition to receiving information from us, you can use the free app to inform us of your child's/children's absences. You can also check on your child's attendance records and timetable and access all of the school's key dates, news updates as well as access the Lealands High School website and social media accounts. All messages are sent via the app free of charge, enabling us to use our resources to support our students' education. If you so wish, you can download the app now. Once your child/children have joined Lealands in September, you will be able to access their information and receive messages.

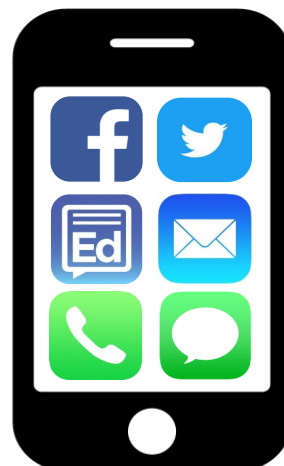
